Southwest Classroom

Second Floor

One of four former classrooms, the SW classroom was renovated using a mix of monies from the John Ben Snow Foundation and private funds. The furnishings in this room include a large walnut dining room table, the telegraph desk from Potts Pharmacy in Pulaski, an ornate spinet piano from the 1850s, an old pump organ and comfortable chairs from various periods. A wood and glass display case is used for rotating displays, while other artifacts also line the shelves mixed between collections. This is a comfortable, well-lit room in which to work and like all rooms this is connected to full wifi.

This large room also contains ten wood shelving units that house an extensive collection of books ranging from published vital records, municipal and county histories from across the northeast and lower Canada, yearbooks from the coverage area High schools such as Pulaski, Sandy Creek, Mexico, Camden, and APW as well as others from Oswego State College and Belleville Academy, military records, atlases and miscellanies journals on genealogy and history. Most of the volumes in this room are original, as opposed to collections on the first floor that are generally reproduction copies.
